The Tate Pumphouse Trail Center is centrally located along the River Trail system and is a natural gathering place and epicenter for a variety of activities including walking, cycling, running, rafting, fishing, and enjoying nature. The Pumphouse is home to the Platte River Trails office and includes public restrooms, exercise equipment, and outside tables and benches. This one of a kind indoor and outdoor venue, available to lease for events, features an elegant interior space, spacious patio, spectacular views of Casper Mountain and the river, a private board room, and ample parking.

THE PLATTE RIVER TRAILS



TRAIL & RIVER SAFETY

- Control your speed and share the trails courteously
- Stay on the trail and keep right
- Wear a helmet when cycling and skating
- Give audible warning when passing
- Dogs must be on a leash at all times except in off-leash areas
- Scoop your dog's poop
- Respect nature and do not litter
- Always wear a flotation device when on the water
- Dress for the weather and water conditions
- Never go in the water alone
- Be aware of water levels and currents
